**Whitefish Bay Little League Sets 2009 Season Registration
for January 11th and January 14th, 2009**

Whitefish Bay, WI -- Whitefish Bay Little League announced today that registration for their 2009 baseball season will be held on Sunday, January 11, 2009 from 4:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. and Thursday, January 15, 2009 from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. at Cahill Park (corner of Fairmount Ave. and Marlborough Drive) in the warming house. For those families new to Whitefish Bay Little League Baseball, an informational meeting will take place at 3:30 p.m. on Sunday, January 11th prior to start of registration also at Cahill Park.

Boys and girls ages 6 to 14 years old as of April 30, 2009 residing in Whitefish Bay, are eligible to participate in the league. Registration fees for children 6 to 12 years old will be \$160 per player for the first and second child in a family and \$135 for the third child and beyond. Registration fees for Juniors age 13 or 14 as of April 30, 2009 - will be \$225 per player. Additionally, there will be a \$50 Watertower Field fee per family to help offset costs for the recent redevelopment of the baseball facility.

Parents or guardians of new and returning players may register on either of the two dates. Registration must be done in person.
