The Middle Level Forensics Association of Wisconsin is an organization that gives **middle school students** across the state the opportunity to have fun while developing and improving their speaking abilities.

Students can participate in a variety of categories that emphasize the use of the spoken word to convince, explain, or entertain. Students can work alone, with a partner, or as part of a group. Depending on the category, the material can be serious or humorous and can be memorized, read from a script, or delivered using notes. Some of the categories allow the students to prepare original material while others use prose, poetry or a speech written by others.

What is forensics?

Forensics is an extracurricular activity for students who like group speaking, want to learn better communication skills, and like to have **FUN** with other middle school students!

Who can join?

Any student in 6th, 7th or 8th grade is eligible to join.

What would I be doing?

A student chooses from a variety of categories and with the help of coaches, prepares a presentation for competition at meets held in schools throughout the Milwaukee area.

When is the Forensics season?

Weekly practices begin. Students must sign up to practice during one of the following times each week:

- Lunch time
- After school in library
- 6:30-7:30 in study room at Whitefish Bay Library

At least one coach will be available during these times.

Meets begin at the end of January and run through March. We will compete in 5 or 6 meets. (please turn over)
